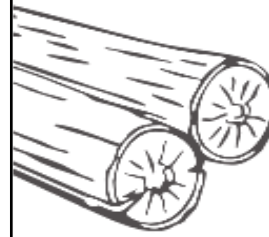



Gunners Kids CIC has been named as a regional finalist in the UK StartUp Awards 2026 in the Rising Star Award category. The non-profit, which supports families across Cornwall, was selected from hundreds of entries to be shortlisted for the regional final.

The UK StartUp Awards was launched to recognise the booming startup scene across the UK, which has accelerated significantly in recent years with around 832,000 new businesses registered in the UK in 2025. Over 900 businesses have been shortlisted for this year's UK StartUp Awards across ten nations and regions. The contribution of these firms, all of which were started in the last three years, is significant, having created nearly 5,000 new jobs since they were established and generating annual sales of over £150 million.

Founded in 2024, Gunners Kids CIC provides vital support to families with children who are affected by the terminal illness of a parent or carer. The non-profit has grown quickly since its inception and is now supported by a dedicated team of six people. This nomination highlights the organisation's rapid momentum and its commitment to providing a lifeline for families across the region through compassionate, community-focused intervention.

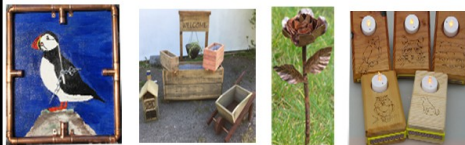

Landscapes Of Distinction; Down The Garden May 2026

Jobs for May

- Prepare summer hanging baskets and tubs. Start planting out summer bedding, canna, dahlia and tender crops but keep an eye out for late frosts.
- Protect vulnerable new plant growth from slug and snails.
- Your lawn is now actively growing and will now require a weekly cut. On warm days ventilate your greenhouse and if necessary, put up shading.
- Collect rainwater for watering on dry days.
- Earth up early potatoes.
- Put in supports for herbaceous perennials before they get too tall.
- Sow herbs.
- Prune spring flowering shrubs straight after flowering; Forsythia, Ribes, Chaenomeles, Kerria, Pyracantha etc.
- Before carrying out pruning or hedge cutting, check for nesting birds. Plant out young vegetables.
- Lift and divide overcrowded spring bulbs, Primula and Hosta as they come into growth.
- Dead headed spring bulbs but remember to leave them at least 6 weeks before cutting them down.
- Take soft tissue cuttings of Hydrangea, Fuchsia and Penstemon.
- Weekly feed houseplants.
- Believe it or not now is the time to start sowing winter bedding plants; wall-flowers, pansy and bellis.
- Keep on top of weeding.

With the clocks recently going forward, it seems like everything has suddenly woken up to lighter evenings and the sound of birdsong. New buds are appearing on trees and wildlife is more active after the cold months. The children at school are looking forward to exciting Summer term events. Here's what has been happening recently:

As part of Reception's and Nursery's topic 'Our Real Life Heroes' we have been fortunate to have some visitors including; Mike from Mountain Rescue, Beacon Vets and a visit from the Guide Dogs. The children have learnt lots from our visitors and have been inspired with jobs that they would like to do when they are older.

Year 1 / 2 are enjoying learning about people who help us in the community. They are writing postcards from the point-of-view of Florence Nightingale, using facts they have learned about her in history. We visited the Eden Project and had a great time exploring the biomes.

Our Year 3/4 classes have had an exciting and busy start to our new term filled with hands-on learning and new discoveries. We have begun our new Geography topic on rivers, starting with an exploration of our local river - the river Gannel and comparing it to famous rivers around the world. In Design and Technology, the children have started designing and building their own bug hotels, cleverly linking their work to our Science topic on 'living things and their habitats'.

Recently, our Year 3/4 classes enjoyed an unforgettable day at a local Food and Farming event, where they learned fascinating facts about sustainable farming, how food is produced, and the importance of caring for our environment. It was an engaging, practical experience that truly brought their learning to life. With so much already happening, our summer term is certainly off to a flying start!

This half term Year 5 and 6 are learning about the history of the local area. We don't have long until our SATs so we are revising lots including at a special Revision club after school.

We visited Woodlands Valley Farm to learn about sustainable farming methods and how beavers are being reintroduced to help stop flooding.

Our Y5 and 6 School Assistant MPs visited County Hall in Truro to work with other school councils to learn about local politics and decision making. They discussed where smoke free areas should be in the county, learnt how to vote in a mock election and learnt how to debate in the main chamber using the microphones. Thank you to local MPs and councillors who attended the event.

We finished a busy term with an Easter Egg Hunt organised by our 'Friends of the School'. We would like to thank everyone who came along and supported the fun in the sun. The money raised will be used to give the children extra opportunities.

We're looking forward to telling you more about our learning adventures next month.
